Proposed Ordinance No. 5637 (Charter amendment)

At the request of Mayor Scott Singer, attached please find Ordinance No. 5637, which proposes to amend the City Charter to change the Mayor and City Council Members' terms of office from three years to four years. If proposed Ordinance No. 5637 is adopted by the City Council, it would be submitted to the electors of the City at the regular election on March 14, 2023 and would become effective upon a favorable vote of a majority of the electors of the City.

If the Charter amendment is adopted by the electors, the terms beginning March 2023 (Mayor Singer, Council Member-elect Francine Nachlas in seat A, and the Council Member to be elected to seat B) would expire March 2027, and, for transition purposes, the terms expiring March 2024 (Council Member Drucker in seat C and Council Member Mayotte in seat D) would be extended by one year and would expire March 2025. The amendment would not change the current two-term limit.

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ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BOCA RATON PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE CITY CHARTER CHANGING THE TERMS OF OFFICE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS FROM THREE (3) YEARS TO FOUR (4) YEARS; EXTENDING THE TERMS OF THOSE COUNCIL MEMBERS WHOSE TERMS ARE DUE TO EXPIRE MARCH 2024 BY ONE ADDITIONAL YEAR; PROVIDING FOR SUBMISSION OF THE PROPOSED CITY CHARTER AMENDMENT TO THE ELECTORS OF THE CITY AT THE REGULAR ELECTION ON MARCH 14, 2023; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, the governing body of a municipality may, by ordinance, submit a proposed amendment to its charter to the electors of the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Boca Raton deems it advisable to amend the City Charter to provide: (i) that the terms of office of the mayor and other city council members

be changed from three (3) years to four (4) years; and (ii) that, to implement such amendment, (a) the terms of office of the mayor and of the two council members (council member seats A and B), whose terms begin on the last day of March 2023, shall expire March 2027, and (b) the terms of office of the two council members whose terms are due to expire March 2024 (council member seats C and D) shall be extended by one additional year and shall expire March 2025; now therefore

THE CITY OF BOCA RATON HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sections 3.03 and 5.05 of the Charter of the City of Boca Raton are hereby amended as follows:

Section 3.03. Elections, terms and term limitations.

The mayor and other city council members shall be elected for three-year four-year terms at the regular city election in the manner provided in Article V of this Charter. The terms of council members shall begin on the last day of March. No person who has been elected to the office of mayor or to the office of council member for two consecutive terms shall be eligible to qualify for election, or be elected, to that office for the succeeding term; provided, however, for transition purposes, council members serving on the city council on March 31, 2005 shall be eligible to qualify for election, and be elected, to that office for a maximum of three consecutive terms (including consecutive terms immediately prior to March 14, 2006). The office of mayor and the office of council member shall be considered separate offices for the purpose of consecutive term limits set forth in this section. For (The terms of office beginning on the last day of March 2023 [mayor and council member seats A and B], shall be four years, and, for transition purposes, the three-current council members, including the mayor, elected at the regular election in March 2005 2021 [council member seats C and D] shall have their current terms of office extended by one additional year and such terms shall

now expire on March 30, 2008 2025.) In the event a vacancy is filled in the office of mayor or council member, by appointment or election as provided in this Charter, the partial term shall not be considered a term for purposes of term limits as specified herein.

Section 5.05. Elections

(a) Regular elections. The regular election shall be held on the second Tuesday of March of each year in which a term of the mayor or city council member expires (which shall be 2006 2025, and every three four (4) years thereafter, for council member seats C and D, and 2008 2023, and every three four (4) years thereafter, for the mayor and council member seats A and B).

(c) Council Member Seats. Candidates for the office of Council Member shall qualify for election to a specific Council Member seat designated A, B, C or D. No candidates for the office of Council Member shall be permitted to qualify for more than one (1) seat. Candidates for the office of Council Member shall be elected to seats A and B at the regular election in 2005 2023, to seats C and D at the regular election in 2006 2025, and thereafter as provided in subsection 5.05(a) above. When more than one candidate qualifies for a seat for the office of City Council Member, the order of the candidates on the ballot for such seat shall be in the order chosen by lot. The candidate for each seat receiving the greatest number of votes from the electors voting for that seat shall be declared elected without a runoff election.

Section 2. The City Charter amendment proposed by this ordinance shall be submitted to the electors of the City of Boca Raton at the regular election of March 14, 2023, and shall be deemed adopted upon the favorable vote of a majority of the City electors voting at that time upon the following question:

Charter Amendment – Length of Terms

The Mayor and City Council Members are elected for three-year terms. The proposed Charter amendment would change the term of office from three years to four years. If adopted, the terms beginning March 2023 would expire March 2027, and, for transition purposes, the terms expiring March 2024 would be extended by one year and would expire March 2025. The amendment would not change the current two-term limit.

Section 3. In the event of adoption by the electorate as provided herein, the City Clerk shall forthwith incorporate the amendment into the City Charter by preparing a true copy of Section 3.03 and 5.05, and shall file the revised articles by mail with the Florida Department of State.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published once in the fifth week and once in the third week immediately prior to the regular election on March 14, 2023.

<u>Section 5</u>. If any section, subsection, clause or provision of this ordinance is held invalid, the remainder shall not be affected by such invalidity.

<u>Section 6</u>. All Charter provisions or parts of Charter provisions, ordinances, and Resolutions, or parts of ordinances and resolutions, in conflict herewith shall be and hereby are repealed.
